



## TOWARDS ABOLITION IN SOUTHEAST ASIA

### CALL FOR PROPOSAL - INDONESIA

**Duration of the grant**

From January 2021 – 3 to 12 months maximum until 31<sup>st</sup> December 2021

**Name of action**

**FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR THIRDS PARTIES FOR AWARENESS ACTIVITIES IN THE PROVINCES - SUPPORT TO THE CIVIL SOCIETY REGARDING ABOLITION OF THE DEATH PENALTY**

**Objective**

General objective: provide support to civil society organizations working on human rights outside the capitals, to promote and raise awareness about abolition of the death penalty in their country, with the aim of strengthening national movements against the death penalty.

**Expected results**

- Raise awareness of local civil society for mobilisation within the national movement in support of abolition;
- increased capacity of elected members of parliament so that they get involved in the planned abolitionist reforms;
- improved conditions of detention on death row, notably through capacity building of judicial and administrative authorities;
- greater circulation of information concerning conditions of detention and trials.

**Action**

Context

The practice of the death penalty in Indonesia remains complicated. Indonesia resumed executions of death row prisoners in 2013, but no execution has been reported since 2016. However, many people are still condemned to death (at least 41 people in 2019) and at least 90 people were in death row by the end of 2019. The death penalty is applied for non-violent acts (economic crimes, drug trafficking), in a non-transparent (lack of official data) and a discriminatory manner – notably against migrants whose rights to defence are not respected (absence of an interpreter). Judicial procedures do not obey the standards of a fair trial and conditions of detention are below minimum standards. However, it is worth noting that Indonesia used to vote against the UN Moratorium Resolution, the trend has changed since 2012 as the State has abstained at the last four votes. Indonesia also ratified the International Covenant on Civil and Political Rights in 2006. It has not ratified the Second Optional Protocol on the abolition of the death penalty. Revision of the penal code, including new dispositions on the death penalty, has been in progress for many years.

Action

Members of civil society in target countries, whether or not they are stakeholders within abolitionist networks, especially those based outside the capitals, often find it difficult to finance awareness-raising activities on the subject of the death penalty. ECPM and KontraS will implement funding for third parties to support the work of civil society outside the capital, so that they can implement effective advocacy for the project's goals, targeting the emergence of new actors and boosting national movements in support of abolition.

**Localisation**

Outside Jakarta, Indonesia

**Duration**

3 to 12 months maximum

The action may include one or more activities. Ongoing projects on October 2021 will have to include an activity for the World Day against the death penalty. **Depending on the evolution of the covid-19 context, the activities planned in the project as well as the budget may be revised.** Priority will be given to actions leading to capitalisation which can be distributed within a regional framework.

<b>Criteria for application</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- civil society organisations or a group of civil society organisations, either formal or informal (a registered organisation or an entity with no legal character);</li> <li>- non-profit;</li> <li>- based outside capitals and/or evidence of significant activity outside the capital;</li> <li>- with a mandate to protect and promote human rights.</li> </ul>
<b>Application :</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- Narrative application form ;</li> <li>- Project budget (template) ;</li> <li>- Proof on non-profit status ;</li> <li>- Activity reports of the organisation from the last two years ;</li> <li>- At least one reference letter from a financial partner in the last two years.</li> </ul>	
<b>Selection criteria</b>	<p><b>Selection:</b> The selection will be done by ECPM and its regional partner, KontraS.</p> <p><b>The project will be selected according to these criteria :</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- the relevance of the activity as regards the target audience</li> <li>- its efficiency</li> <li>- possibility of capitalisation, reproducibility and distribution within the regional framework.</li> </ul> <p>The amount of the funding will be defined regarding the provisional budget</p>
